# Scholarship Notes

## Year 9 Art Scholarship

Pupils must bring a portfolio of work in a variety of media; this can include 2D and 3D works in observed drawing, painting, photography, mixed media/collage, printmaking. Any 3D work must be photographed from several angles – please do not bring the actual piece. A minimum of eight pieces of work.

Project to complete prior to the day:

Inspired by the work of Giorgio Morandi set up a still life using the same subject matter.

Take several photographs of a variety of different compositions. Present six of these A4 photographs on a mounted sheet.

Choose one to draw on to an A3 sheet of paper. Do no trace from the photographs. Produce an observed tonal pencil drawing of the still life and a further work using media of your choice e.g charcoal, collage, pen, coloured pencils, paint etc.

Please add this work to your portfolio. Portfolios must be handed in the Friday before the scholarship week.

Pupils will also be given an observed drawing test for an hour and they will have a chat with the Head of Art about their portfolio work

## Year 9 Design & Technology Scholarship

To be a Design and Technology Scholar, the candidates must be able to demonstrate the love and passion for the subject and show they have creative and problem solving abilities. A strength in Art, Maths and Science is desirable but not compulsory.

### ***What the candidate must bring to the interview:***

1. Pupils must bring a portfolio of six or more creative outcomes that demonstrate some ability in the following disciplines. Drawing, construction, model making, Computer Aided Design (CAD) and or Computer aided Manufacture (CAM). Any 3D work must be photographed from different angles and presented in the portfolio.
  - a. N.B. Please do not bring the actual 3D work.
2. A standard empty Matchbox filled with a variety of small objects to demonstrate creativity, independent thinking and spatial arrangement. A discussion about the contents will start a creative conversation.
3. Prior to assessment, please complete the following project to present.

Choose one of the following:

Packaging Design:

- (i) Research then design a new flavour and brand of Crisp Packet new brand and flavoured Crisp Packet
- (ii) Research then design a new breakfast cereal box.

- All outcomes are to be made using appropriate materials and media.

***During the assessment interview:*** Pupils will also be given a Design and Technology assessment for an hour, which will consist of a drawing and model making test. They will also talk to the Head of Design and Technology about their portfolio work.

Portfolios will be looked at on the Friday prior to the assessment day.

### Year 9 Drama Scholarship

If you are interested in applying for a Drama scholarship for the junior school you need to put together a portfolio of work. This should include programmes and/or information from any drama productions in and outside of school you have been involved in (including prep school); LAMDA certificates or equivalent; any other documents you deem relevant/appropriate.

You will also need to put together a 2 minute monologue. This should have been learnt by heart and rehearsed ready for performance. This will be performed in front of the Head of Drama on the day and then a short interview with the Head of Drama will commence afterwards. You need to ensure that you choose something which challenges you and that showcases your talent and ability range. Please also provide a typed copy of the monologue on the day.

The scholarship application form will ask you to provide a referee. This could be a teacher, tutor, housemistress/master or LAMDA teacher. The reference should be relevant to the type of scholarship you are applying for.

### Year 9 Music Scholarship

A number of scholarships are awarded annually to outstanding candidates able to offer two (or more) instruments (voice is acceptable as an instrument) to Grade 6 standard (*first instrument*) and to Grade 3 standard (*second instrument*). All candidates for scholarships will be expected to do some aural tests and sight reading. Pre-audition appointments should be made during the autumn term prior to the year of entry. There will be a chance to ask the Director of Music and his colleagues' questions and to look around the department during the pre-audition. Candidates are also required to provide a portfolio of certificates and references.

### Year 9 Sport Scholarship

Each year a number of awards are made to candidates who, whilst being academically ambitious, can make a significant contribution to the sporting success of the school. These individuals will be major Games players with the major games for boys being Rugby, Football, Hockey, Cricket, Tennis and Athletics and Hockey, Netball, Lacrosse, Tennis and Athletics for girls.

It is likely that successful applicants will currently be playing one of the major games to at least District level or above. They will have made a significant contribution to the life of their current school and are expected to make the same commitment to Worth. They will also be expected to contribute to major games other than their preferred sport and in so doing, provide a role model for others.

Those selected will be expected to show initiative and possess strong personal qualities of leadership, morality/fair play and loyalty. They will have a strong desire to succeed and work well with other team players. Award holders will be expected to satisfy the School's normal entrance requirements at the appropriate stage. The value of the award is at the Head Master's discretion, depending on the suitability and credentials of the candidate.

Sports Scholars at Worth benefit from access to the Talented Athlete Support Programme (TASP) which includes:

- Strength and Conditioning

#### Application Procedure

Reports on the ability and attitude of the candidate will be required from the student's current Head, Coaches and P.E. teachers should be submitted with the application. Details of achievements and representative honors' must be included on the Scholarship Application Form (available on the website) and copies of certificates should be included in the portfolio. Students must also complete a self-evaluation of their strengths and weaknesses and in no more than 200 words, describe the contributions that they will make to Sport at Worth.
