Scholarship Notes

Year 12 Art Scholarship

Pupils must bring a portfolio of work including examples of observed drawing, painting observed and abstract, Print making, mixed media works. Any 3D work must be photographed. Please also bring an example of sketchbook pages showing the development of ideas, either photographed or photocopied if they cannot bring the actual book.

As a separate project prior to the scholarship day, the candidate must produce a final work using the theme Ordinary and Extra Ordinary. They can produce a drawing, collage or painting on A2 paper, with a series of studies mounted on an A1 sheet of paper. These studies must show the development of their idea through recording subject matter and ideas, experimenting with media and refining their ideas in to a final idea and art work. This work can be added to the candidate's portfolio.

Pupils will also be given an observed drawing test for an hour and they will have a chat with the Head of Art about their portfolio work. Portfolios will be looked at on the Friday prior to the assessment day.

Year 12 Drama Scholarship

Portfolio of Evidence

If you are interested in applying for a Drama scholarship for the Sixth Form you need to put together a portfolio of work. This should include programmes/information from any drama productions in and outside of school you have been involved in (including prep school); LAMDA certificates or equivalent; any other documents you deem relevant/appropriate.

Performance Monologue

You also need to put together a 3 minute monologue, which has been learnt by heart and rehearsed ready for performance. This will be performed in front of the Head of Drama on the day and then a short interview with the Head of Drama will commence afterwards. You need to ensure that you choose something which challenges you and that showcases your talent and ability range. Please also provide a copy of the monologue on the day.

Reference

The scholarship application form will ask you to provide a referee. This could be your teacher, tutor, housemistress/master, LAMDA teacher or a teacher from a previous school. The reference should be relevant to the type of scholarship you are applying for.

Year 12 Music Scholarship

Students are expected to play their first and second instrument (voice is acceptable as an instrument) to Grade 8 standard (first instrument) and Grade 6 standard (second instrument). Students will also complete a written Music Paper and the General Paper. There will be a scholarship interview.

All candidates for scholarships will be expected to do some aural tests and sight reading. Pre-audition appointments should be made during the autumn term prior to the year of entry. There will be a chance to ask the Director of Music and his colleagues' questions and to look around the department during the pre-audition. Candidates are also required to provide a portfolio of certificates and references.

Year 12 Sport Scholarship

Each year a number of awards are made to candidates who, whilst being academically ambitious, can make a significant contribution to the sporting success of the school. These individuals will be major Games players with the major games for boys being Rugby, Football, Hockey, Cricket, Tennis and Athletics and Hockey, Netball, Lacrosse, Tennis and Athletics for girls.

It is likely that successful applicants will currently be playing one of the major games to at least District level or above. They will have made a significant contribution to the life of their current school and are expected to make the same commitment to Worth. They will also be expected to contribute to major games other than their preferred sport and in so doing, provide a role model for others.

Those selected will be expected to show initiative and possess strong personal qualities of leadership, morality/fair play and loyalty. They will have a strong desire to succeed and work well with other team players. Award holders will be expected to satisfy the School's normal entrance requirements at the appropriate stage. The value of the award is at the Head Master's discretion, depending on the suitability and credentials of the candidate.

Sports Scholars at Worth benefit from access to the Talented Athlete Support Programme (TASP) which includes:

- o 1-1/small group coaching with top coaches
- o Access to video analysis and performance monitoring
- o Strength and Conditioning
- o Nutritional advice and performance monitoring
- o Access to top quality competition through school fixtures, pathway programmes and club links.
- o Co-ordinated development with National Governing Bodies.
- o Time-management and academic support through mentoring.
- o A Performance Diary including:
 - Training programmes and logs.
 - Goal setting/Targets and performance monitoring
 - Nutritional information and advice
 - Player profiling
 - Access to visiting sports professionals for lectures and coaching clinics

Application Procedure

Reports on the ability and attitude of the candidate will be required from the student's current Head, Coaches and P.E. teachers should be submitted with the application. Details of achievements and representative honors' must be included on the Scholarship Application Form (available on the website) and copies of certificates should be included in the portfolio. Students must also complete a self-evaluation of their strengths and weaknesses and in no more than 200 words, describe the contributions that they will make to Sport at Worth.
